Lucille Stone Fultz Holland, 92, of Roanoke, Virginia, transitioned to Heaven on February 13th, 2021 in Richmond, Virginia.

Lucille was born in Henry County, Virginia to the late Bertha Millner and Reverend Dr. Samuel T. Stone on June 12th, 1928. She graduated from Henry County Training High School in Martinsville, VA. While embarking on her calling in life she moved to Brooklyn and Long Island but made Roanoke her home. Once settling in Roanoke, she obtained her cosmetology license from American Beauty School. She worked as a cosmetologist at her very own Lucille's Beauty Salon in Southwest Roanoke for forty plus years. She consistently improved her practice by learning new skills from various hair seminars that she attended up and down the east coast. She advanced the skills of others through teaching clipper, cutting and coloring techniques at a variety of settings including Dudley Cosmetology University in North Carolina. Lucille's curiosity to learn and explore led her to study politics, insurance, medicine, and real estate.

Although she was well known for her beauty techniques, her passion to serve the Lord and to teach others about his love is what she will be remembered for most. She sang in multiple choirs in the Roanoke Valley and served as an organist in various churches. She was a dedicated servant of High Street Baptist Church, Bethel Way of the Cross, St. Matthews and Valley Word. Clients, family, friends, nursing home staff and anyone who was blessed to be in her presence have all been touched by her powerful prayers and her daily example of living for the lord. Grace, wit, unconditional love, and elegance were all characteristics of her beautiful personality. Her kind heart, captivating smile, stylish clothing, contemporary heels and Cadillac were sure to catch your attention. She was truly a godmother to many and a true angel on earth.

She is preceded in death by her maternal grandparents; Robert and Nora Hairston Millner, paternal grandparents; Frederick and Carrie Watkins Stone, parents; Samuel and Bertha Millner Stone, sisters; Barbara Jean Miller, Blanche Robinson, and Hilda Faatz.

Of the noteworthy influences our aunt had in our lives, the one by which we benefited the most was her encouragement (and her stellar example) to conduct ourselves with propriety and self-respect.

The second eldest of 6 daughters to their parents, Reverend and Mrs. Samuel T. Stone, Lucille played the piano and sang hymns with her sisters as they traveled with their parents from church to church. As adults, the best times were during reunions when the sisters would gather around a piano or organ while Lucille played and sing those old hymns together in perfect harmony once again, teasing each other and laughing with about who was singing out of tune or who forgot the lyrics.

We carry with us the valuable lessons and characteristics our aunt instilled in us. Have we done a good enough job in passing them down to our own children? We surely hope so. In this way our dear Aunt Lucille will live on in perpetuity.
