



## Ms. Louise P. Paige

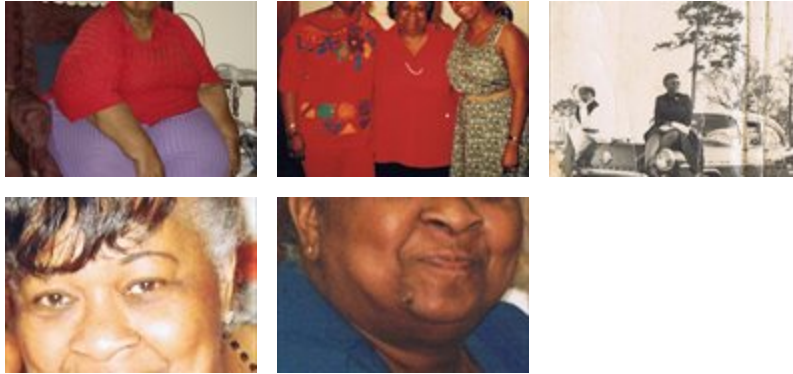
October 8, 1931 - August 12, 2010
