She inherited an unquestionable love for all children from her mother. She would light up and glow when speaking of a newborn child. Upon her retirement, she and her late husband Henry Pegues moved from New Jersey to Virginia. Henry and Lula spent several cheerful years together in Virginia until Henry was called home.

Throughout her life, she faced all challenges as just another assignment to

conquer. With the passing of Henry, she hung in there as usual and pushed forward. Eventually, her health began to decline to a point where she just couldn't physically do it anymore. She never complained. She fought a good fight and answered God's whisper to come home on June 22nd, 2024.
