January 6, 1951 - February 11, 2013

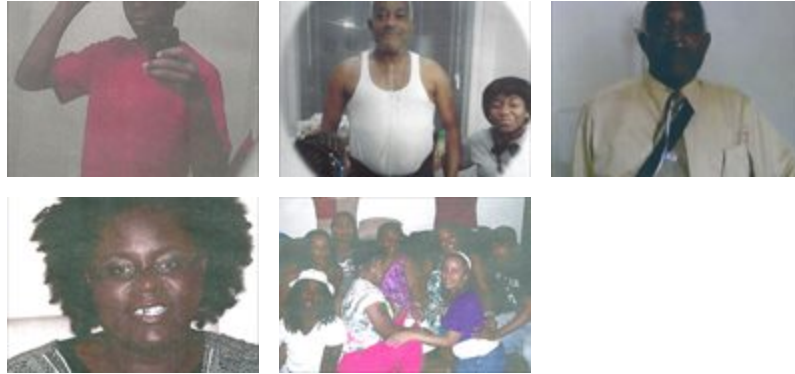
