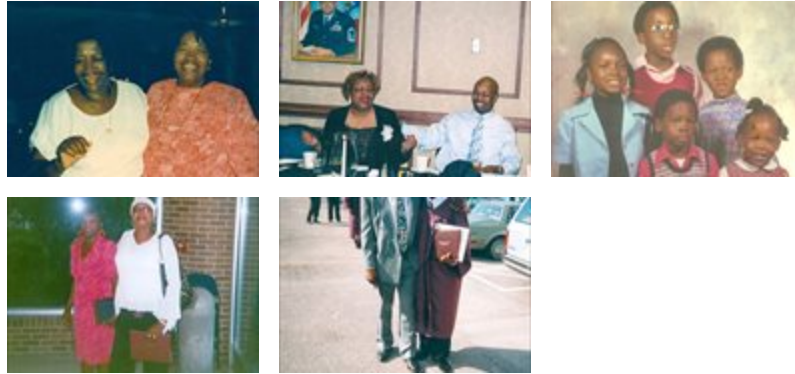
The family will be receiving friends at 1340 23rd Street Newport News and will assemble there by 11 a.m. Friday for the processional.
